# Student Spotlight: Helen's Data-Driven Necklace Shines on the International Stage

We're proud to share that one of our long-time students, Helen Perry, has created a remarkable piece for The Jewelry Code: Data as Wearable Art, an exhibition at the National Museum of Kazakhstan. The exhibition transforms real statistics into wearable art, using jewellery to communicate truth in an age of information overload.

Helen's necklace is based on data she analyzed for UN Women on youth in nine East and Southern African countries. Each metal element—sand cast in silver or bronze and detailed with beads—represents real percentages linked to education, employment, and the lived realities of young people in Africa.



Her central baobab motif reflects the high rate of teenage pregnancy in Mozambique, while surrounding elements portray patterns across countries such as Uganda, Malawi, Ethiopia, South Africa, Botswana, and Kenya.

It's a powerful example of how jewellery can tell complex human stories through thoughtful design and craftsmanship. We are so proud of you Helen!
